





RULES AND REGULATIONS SCHOOL/COLLEGE TRANSPORT

Christ Academy has a good transport system with adequate buses. Bus stops are planned for the convenience of student's school timings. Students are expected to maintain proper decorum in the bus.

The Bus Rules are as follows.

1. Transportation is an optional service of the school. Those who need only can apply for it. Observing the rules of the bus shall be followed strictly.
2. Each bus is equipped with a GPS for parents to monitor the vehicle's location and arrival. The Mobile App 'Neotrack' can be downloaded from Google Play or App Store based on the kind of mobile they have
3. There will be a caretaker and teachers in the bus. (Teachers will be seated at the rear or middle in the bus to monitor the discipline of the students).
4. A student using the school bus is expected to be at the bus stop at least ten minutes before the scheduled arrival of the bus. The student has to be on the correct side of the arriving bus.
5. Bus routes are very scheduled in order to get the children and teachers to school on time.
6. If a student misses the allotted bus it is the responsibility of the parents to drop their wards to the school and inform the office. However the student will return by the allotted bus.
7. Any change in pick up/drop point or mode of transport by the students, even for a day, should be notified to the school authorities (transport@christacademy.in, grade teacher and transport coordinator) in writing by the parent / authorized guardian.

8. Extension of pickup and drop point will not be applicable. If the residence is changed, the children can commute from the bus at nearest availability of service. In case of permanent change of transport route, the application must be filed along with administrative charges at the School Office.
9. Bus services will be discontinued without further notice for children who do not follow bus rules, damage accessories in the bus, offend passers – by with their actions or words.
10. Without ID card, entry of bus is prohibited.
11. If a student is missing the bus at 1:30 PM and 3:30 PM without any permission by teacher, parents need to pick them up from campus. No facility will be provided for such students.
12. Children are expected to maintain proper decorum in the bus and follow the instructions given below:
 - A. Students are advised to be seated;
 - B. Not to make noise in the bus;
 - C. Not to stick out head outside the bus and put their hands out even for waving;
 - D. Not to be rude to people on the road;
 - E. Not to eat food inside the bus;
 - F. No object should be discarded inside or thrown outside the bus;
 - G. If any student is reported to be throwing objects outside from the school bus, strict disciplinary action will be taken against him/her;
13. If any damage occurs (seat cover, fire extinguisher, side glass etc.) it will be charged.
14. The bus personnel/teacher in charge is responsible for maintaining discipline in the bus. Any serious offence will be reported to the School Management.
15. As soon as students disperse from the school, they need to go to the bus straightway without blocking the way of the other students.
16. If any student is found without enrolment for the transport facility, charges will be doubled than the actual transport fee.
17. A special whistle will be blow to indicate the movement of the 1st Bus. No student will be allowed to enter the bus after that whistle.

The early years of life are crucial for optimum development of an individual. So we at Christ Academy provide a healthy atmosphere of love, warmth and opportunities for learning. It is hoped that this institution will rise to greater heights of glory and become the “Alma Mater” to many a great Indian.

LOCATION

It is conveniently located in a lush green, pollution free, spacious site to enable children to feel themselves in a natural environment and is highly accessible from different parts of Bangalore.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Academic Year

The school year begins in June and ends in March. The whole session is divided into three terms. June to Aug, Sep to Dec and Jan to March in order to have proper and systematic working and to give a balance to the whole syllabus.

2. Admission

Admission to the school is restricted by certain policies of the management and by the conditions of age, ability and conduct. The age of admission to class 1 is 5 yrs/8 months on or before 1st June of the year of admission.

3. Withdrawal

- a. Transfer Certificate will be issued only when the parent/guardian applies for it in the prescribed form after all

the dues have been cleared in the office. The application should be given one month in advance.

- b. If the Head of the Institution finds any student's performance unsatisfactory and orders withdrawal of such student, it is obligatory on the part of the parent or guardian to withdraw the student.

4. Attendance

- a. Regular attendance is insisted upon. No student should absent himself/herself from class without sufficient reason and prior permission.
- b. Reasons for the absence must be clearly stated in the "Leave Record" of the handbook.
- c. In case of serious illness the Principal must be informed within five days with a Doctor's certificate accompanied by the leave application from the parent / guardian.
- d. Students who do not get 80% attendance for the year are liable to be detained or be advised to leave the school.

5. Discipline

- a. Refinement of manners, habits of obedience and order, neatness in person and dress and punctuality are required at all time.
- b. Students shall be responsible for the safe custody of their belongings. As a precautionary measure, it is suggested that they have their names inscribed on articles like tiffin carriers, umbrellas, school bag, shoes, pencil box and pencils.
- c. It is not advisable for the students to wear gold ornaments or to bring other valuable articles to school. The school will not be responsible for the loss of such articles of students.
- d. Any damage caused to the property of the school is punishable according to the nature of the offence and fine will be imposed . Lost and found articles should be deposited in the office.

6. Conveyance

- a. School buses will be available on selected routes. At the bus stop children must get into the bus in an orderly manner. As a

safety measure they should not put their hands or head out even to greet anyone.

- b. After getting off the bus, children should wait at the bus stop till the bus moves again. They should be very cautious and see that they cross the road only after the bus has left the stop to ensure safety.
- c. Parents / children must be at least 5 minutes earlier in the morning and evening to board / collect their children from the bus. If parents are not at the bus stop the child would be brought back to school.

7. Parental Cooperation

- a. The active cooperation of parents with the school is an essential prerequisite for the welfare of the students. They should encourage children to participate in all the activities and school functions.
- b. Parents can meet the class teachers on working Saturdays: Grades 1-4 (8.30 am to 11.00 am) and Grades 5-8 (11.30 am to 1.30 pm) with prior appointment. Also, parents can communicate with the class teacher through email. Parents are not allowed to enter the classroom during teaching hours.
- c. Phone calls to teachers cannot be made during class hours. You can leave your message at the office and you can call the office for the reply between 2.00 pm and 2.30 pm.
- d. While the management will endeavor to ensure the safety and welfare of your child, it cannot be held responsible for any accident or mishap that may occur to the student in the school premises, or while your child is being transported to and from the school. You may also rest assured that we have a qualified nurse on the premises to extend prompt FIRST AID to your child in the event of an injury.
- e. Any change in address or telephone number must be intimated to the school. For any queries regarding bus fees, school fees etc, kindly contact only the office.
- f. The school gate will be closed at 8.25 a.m. If a child is late he/she will not be permitted to enter the school.

- g. Gate pass is mandatory for picking your ward.

8. Examination and Promotion

Promotion is on the basis of a series of examinations, assignments and project work. Worksheets, written and oral class assessments and activities are taken into consideration for grading. Promotion will be based on the marks scored for the entire year. No retest will be given for any examination. If the student is found unable to cope with the syllabus, the student will be advised to change the stream.

9. Fee

- a. School fees have to be paid in two installments. First installment during the admission and second installment in September. Fee receipts must be retained and produced as proof of payment, if needed. All school dues must be cleared before a student is permitted to sit for the final examination. Fees once paid will not be refunded.
- b. Students joining or leaving the school in the middle of a term shall pay for the full term. They have to clear all dues before taking any certificate.
- c. Late payment of fees will be fined.
- d. Fees can be paid online through the parents login.

10. School Uniform

- a. The school uniform is compulsory on all school days and at school functions. Students can come in casual (colour) dress only on their birthdays. It is the duty of the parents to see that students come to school neatly dressed in the prescribed uniform.
- b. Girls who have long hair must wear their hair in two plaits with black bands. Fancy clips, nail polish, ornaments, anklets, bangles, kajal and flowers should not be worn to school.
- c. Boys must have short hair cuts.
- d. Shoes must be cleaned and polished daily.

11. SMS service: All important messages & absenteeism will be intimated to parents through SMS.
